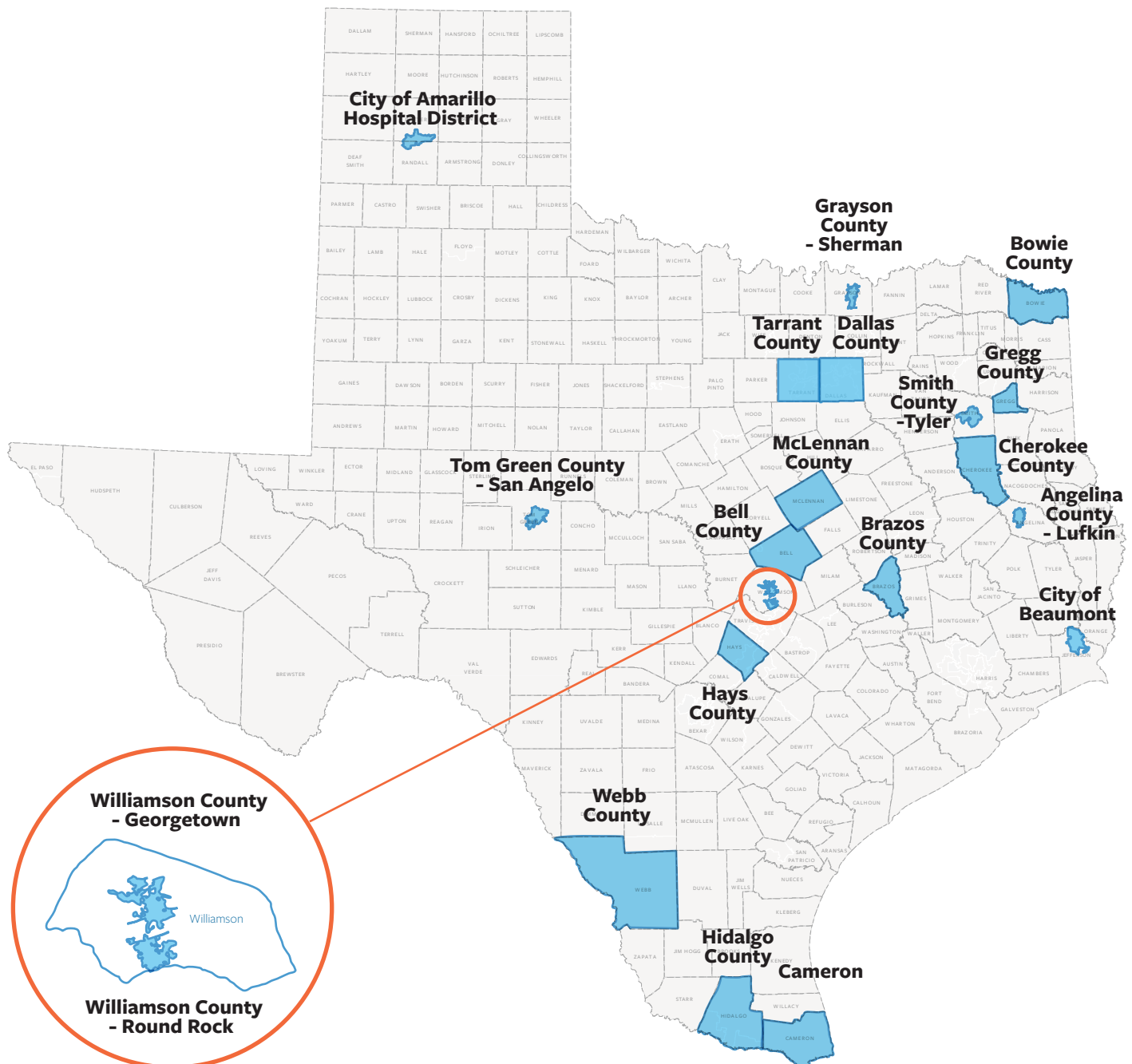


Local Provider Participation Funds in Texas

Since 2013, Texas hospitals in 19 cities and counties across the state have created local provider participation funds for the purpose of generating parts of the non-federal share of Medicaid payments. With approval from the Texas Legislature, non-public hospitals in a particular jurisdiction agree to impose an assessment, not to exceed six percent, on their total net patient revenues. These quarterly assessments are matched with federal Medicaid dollars and paid to the hospitals in the jurisdiction to supplement the below-cost Medicaid payment.

In previous legislative sessions, the Texas Hospital Association supported hospitals in pursuing LPPFs as a local solution to local health care challenges and will continue to work with all of its member hospitals that are interested in building LPPFs.
